DUBROVNIK



City tour of Dubrovnik

Discover the Old city, included on UNESCO's world Heritage List, surrounded by mighty walls and fortresses, well preserved over the centuries. Our walking tour takes us to Stradun, the elegant main street with Onofrio's Fountains, Franciscan Monastery with the Old Pharmacy, Orlando's Column, Church of St Blaise – the town's patron saint, Cathedral and other sights. At the end we suggest taking a nearby cable car that will lead you to the top of the hill, from where you can get a unique perspective of the city.



Pirate's game onboard Karaka



Sail into the 16th century and immerse yourself in history with this magnificent replica of a traditional "Karaka" ship (known in English as an argosy or carrack) from the era of the republic of Dubrovnik.


The ship is an ideal venue for different events and activities: from pirate's game and theme parties, sunset cruise, island hopping, to dinner and party planning.





Pelješac wine and dine

The tasting of Ston oysters and authentic local red wines Plavac mali, Dingač and Postup on Pelješac is a genuine hedonistic experience. With a tour of the impressive Walls of Ston and the oldest European saltworks, discover the most famous wineries of Pelješac, make sure to pick up a bottle of wine as a souvenir and just enjoy the beauty and tranquility of the peninsula. On the way back we can stop in Trsteno and visit the Arboretum, with a 15th century summer residence of the Dubrovnik patrician family Gucetić-Gozze, surrounded by a beautiful renaissance garden.



Konavle – Dubrovnik’s serene and green oasis

Konavle valley, situated only 20 km from Dubrovnik, where we would enjoy hospitality of our hosts who would introduce us with the traditions of this beautiful wine growing region. There you can learn about the traditional process of making olive oil and homemade brandy, production of flour as well as another traditional craft – wool processing. Of course, taste some made herb brandy while enjoying the stunning view over Konavle valley.



Off-road adventure

Take an ATV-quad or buggy and ride freely through the nature, explore small villages, old stone houses, olive trees, vineyards and spectacular viewpoints. Visit parts of the Dubrovnik region that are inaccessible by car, as you will drive along country roads and off-road tracks while discovering the beautiful landscape along the way.

Sea kayaking around the Old town

See the 'Pearl of the Adriatic' from the water on a kayak tour from Dubrovnik. Explore caves and beauties around mysterious Lokrum island, also called 'The island of love' and stroll along palm-fringed beaches. Enjoy a unique view of the City walls and you will discover the richness of the Adriatic underwater.






SPLIT



City tour Split

Split's main site is Diocletian's Palace, one of the most famous monuments in Croatia. The Palace, St. Dominus' Cathedral is another of Split's famous sites, located on the site of Diocletian's former mausoleum. Worth a visit are the cellars of Diocletian, located next to the southern wall of the palace. Although they are empty, they are quite impressive.



City tour of Trogir

Trogir is a typical Dalmatian historical town and harbor. This colorful town was recognized by UNESCO in 1979 by gaining World's Heritage status. On the entrance into the St. Lawrence Cathedral, you can see it's a majestic portal of Radovan. It is the most significant medieval portal in this part of Europe. One of the major sights is Tower of Kamerlengo, which was the Venetian governor's palace.



National Park Krka

National Park Krka are the biggest and most famous waterfalls in whole Dalmatia and are situated 20 km from Šibenik. With its 7 beautiful waterfalls and total length of 242 m, river Krka is the real beauty. That is a natural and well-maintained eco-system almost untouched by human hand. Waterfalls Krka with fish and water plants offer every visitor a true experience of nature power and beauty. Island Visovac from the 15. century and the monastery, represents the identity of Krka National Park and waterfall «Roški slap» will take your breath away.



Klis fortress

Visit one of the most important medieval structures in all of Dalmatia – the Klis Fortress. Overlooking the city of Split, in the mountain pass between Mosor and Kozjak, is a medieval fortress, built into a rocky ridge giving visitors an incredible view of the entire Split area, and the islands of Brač, Hvar and Vis.





Island hopping from Split

The biggest advantage of Split is its vicinity of some of the most beautiful islands in all Croatia and you can visit most of them in just one day by boat, like Biševo, Vis, Brač, Paklinski and Hvar. While on Biševo we recommend visiting Blue Cave, a remarkable phenomenon - when the sunlight reflects off the seabed, a mesmerizing blue hue fills the cave. Swim in the waters of the Blue Lagoon with its shades of dazzling turquoise and sapphire, explore charming villages and Hvar's old town which dates back thousands of years. Swim and snorkel in crystal-clear seas, relax and play on idyllic beaches and feast on local food and wine.



Boat ride Cetina (Omiš)

Omiš is a picturesque town of Mediterranean atmosphere at the mouth of the river Cetina. In his history Omiš was ruled by pirates for more than 2 centuries. Take a boat trip through the canyon of the river Cetina from the mouth of the river (in Omiš). Its an extraordinary experience passing through fields of chervil under treetops at the foot of the mountains, watching ducks, fish and water hens in crystal clear water.



HVAR



City tour Hvar

Hvar Town is a wonderful place to visit, and a great place to stay at if you like your holidays to be a bit more refined. Visit St. Stephen's Square and St. Stephen's Cathedral with its impressive bell tower. Don't miss the Arsenal, a home to a theatre on the first floor. This was Croatia's first theatre, and one of the first community theatres in Europe. Take a stroll down Hvar's promenade and visit the Franciscan monastery which contains large and impressive painting of the Last Supper. Above Hvar Town is the impressive fortress Fortica or Spanjola, built in the 16th century.



Wine tasting

In the 4th Century BC, the Ancient Greeks brought grapevine to this sunny island and planted it in the fertile plain of the ancient village of Pharos. Amidst centuries of rich and turbulent history, the people of Hvar have cultivated their vineyards with great skill and care. Wines from the island have become very competitive at wine fairs, winning First Place prizes and being counted as some of the best wines in the country.

Visit one of the local wineries where you will be able to taste the wines of your choice. Furthermore, the owner will explain you a whole process of wine making.

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
